Shooting in Turkey by Chloe Gillatt

As this was my first international competition I didn't know what to expect, but I had an amazing time. Firstly, I found I wasn't scared of flying, which isn't a bad thing, and I discovered the wonders of duty at the airport! Fortunately I got on really well with all of the 30 staff, coaches etc.

The hotel we stayed in was huge and apparently 4*, which sounded great at first but we soon realized it was a 'foreign 4 *' from the food it served! The shooting venue was only a few minutes' walk from the hotel, and it was really impressive - pretty much like four aircraft hangers stuck together. The competition was on the Wednesday. Unfortunately nerves got the better of me, but I guess I did the best I could, getting a personal best for a FITA 18 triple spot in a competition. I came 38th, and with only the first 32 archers proceeding to the next rounds, I joined in the cheering and heckling with the rest of those who didn't get through. Great Britain earned the reputation of being the loudest and liveliest team which was funny. Our chants even got the American commentator joining in over the tannoy. Overall, my trip to Turkey was one of the best times I've had the chance to experience. I have come back with photos, many new friends, Turkish memorabilia and confidence. I will go again next year, and now I know what to expect I know I'll shoot better. I'd like to thank all the people who have helped me get to where I am now - they know who they are.

Use your combination code in the pad press and enter, also use the same code to close. If the electricity is not working, then there is a 'release key' available so the door can be operated manually. Please ask a committee member about the key's whereabouts. In the future you will also find a combination lock fitted to the pedestrian gate accessed through the car park; this will be fitted for insurance and security reasons. Again, you will need to use the same combination number. Please lock the gates if you are the last to leave.

Other Projects underway and to come: the removal and replacement of the Portakabins, flattening and resurfacing the car park area outside the club house, improvements to the river – perhaps these are areas where you have expertise and could offer your services.
