Annual General Meeting 2014 – 12th November

This year's AGM will be on the 12th November.

Redruth Community Centre.

Starting 7:30pm (meeting room 1).

Although this is probably not the most exciting event in the Club's Calendar, it is an important event, so please come if you can.

The AGM will be preceded by a short EGM (starting 7:30pm) to cover a brief motion by the Committee to amend the constitution to reflect the recent formation of the Redruth Disabled Archers Section.

The AGM will bring all members up to date on matters under discussion, club achievements and notable events in the previous year (through the medium of the Officer's Reports).

There will then be a break for refreshments (please bring a contribution of food!).

We will also be electing Club Officers for the next year – note: all the Officer / Committee positions become vacant each year. Some of the existing Officers are willing to re-stand for election and continue in their roles next year. There will also, however, be some vacancies.

Tournament Organiser

Estate Manager

Coaching Coordinator

Disabled Section Representative

There is a short summary of each of these roles later in this Update.

There will also be the opportunity to discuss any other business you might like to put forward. Please let me know ASAP if you have anything for this.

Tournament Dress Code (Again !)

Phil Gillbanks (GWAS Judge Liaison Officer) has asked all Clubs to make their members aware of the following, tightening up compliance with "Rule 307":

"At the GWAS Committee meeting last weekend, we the Judges have been instructed to ensure that the Tournament Dress Code is being followed. There have been too many incidents of arch-

ers turning up in clothing which is contrary to the rules, and expecting to shoot. Up to now we have been lenient and allowed the archers to shoot.

We have been told to stop this happening and as of January 2015, any archer turning up for a tournament in the wrong clothing will be asked to change or will not be allowed to shoot

———NO EXCEPTIONS.
These rules [Rule 307] apply to Record Status, Regional and County Tournaments automatically, but if the entry form for any non record status or club tournament has any wording to the effect that Archery GB rules apply then these tournaments will be covered as well."

Please note that the colour Olive Drab is a greyish green or a brownish green (look it up on google). If you are not sure then don't take the

chance, don't wear it.

Clothing manufacturers trade marks are allowed but any other wording or logo's must be Archery related.

Indoor Shooting – Second Weekly Session

I have been investigating the options for a possible second weekly indoor shooting session over winter. The only vaguely sensible available option at the moment would be a Wednesday evening at Redruth School. However, this is not cheap at £82 for 3 hours, so this is something we could only seriously consider if we knew this would be well attended, and that it wouldn't seriously reduce attendance at the Saturday sessions at Pool School. We generally make a loss from indoor shooting, with all the hard work at tournaments, beginner's course and have-a-go's helping to subsidise this. We can afford one well-attended session, but probably not two poorly attended ones. We can discuss this as any other business at the AGM.

Club Officer Roles

Here are some job descriptions for some of the Club Officer roles that are "up for grabs" at the AGM on the 12th November:

Tournament Secretary:

To issue club tournament entry forms, target lists and results sheets to interested outside clubs and individuals as necessary. To Co-ordinate and advise the committee on preparations necessary for club tournaments. To supervise scoring and production of results at tournaments. To keep a record of money raised and pad out to present to the Treasurer. To keep a record of the Club's trophies and their whereabouts.

Coaching Coordinator:

Coordinating and publicising (either directly

or through and with others) coaching-led events within the club and outside; such as beginners' courses, improvers sessions, school coaching/teaching, have-a-go/fete activities, senior and junior coaching days, individual and group coaching events.

Estate Manager

Maintenance and improvement of the club grounds and buildings, directly or through and with the assistance of others.

Disabled Section Representative

This will be a new role, that has not yet been formally defined, but will almost certainly involve looking after the interests of, and encouraging participation by, members of the disabled section.
